### **METHODS OF INSTRUCTION**

E.G, LECTURE: A PROBLEM-SOLVING LECTURE/A LECTURE SUPPORTED BY A MULTIMEDIA PRESENTATION/ DISTANCE LEARNING CLASSES: TEXT ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION/PROJECT WORK (RESEARCH PROJECT, IMPLEMENTATION PROJECT, PRACTICAL PROJECT)/ GROUP WORK (PROBLEM SOLVING, CASE STUDY, DISCUSSION)/DIDACTIC GAMES/ DISTANCE LEARNING LABORATORY CLASSES: DESIGNING AND CONDUCTING EXPERIMENTS)

Observation, evaluation of activity, evaluation of the final work (presentation).

## **COURSE CONTENT**

Lectures: History of Polish settlement in the world. Definitions and concepts - migrant, emigrant, Polish diaspora, Poles abroad, Polish diaspora, voluntary and forced settlers. Voluntary and forced emigration. Migration processes - their potential in numbers, directions and specificity.

Exercises: Polish expansion in the east; voluntary settlement processes, development of the Eastern Borderlands; polonization of the population of the Polish-Lithuanian state; the role of the Roman Catholic and Greek Catholic Church; forced Polish settlement - deportations, deportations, expulsions, resettlements. The role of Poles and people of Polish origin in the process of management and development of Russia and the areas of North-East Asia; Polish expansion in the west - political emigration and "for bread"; the role of Polish communities in the West in various historical epochs; the contemporary position of Poles in the world.

#### **COURSE ASSESSMENT CRITERIA**

The basis for passing a subject is activity in the class and preparation of a credit work (presentation) on a subject chosen by the doctoral candidate. Assessment components:

Activity during classes - o to 25% [the result of student's activity during work (50%); assessment of the value of the statement (50%)]

Knowledge of the literature – o to 25% [evaluation of the level of use of the literature (50%); evaluation of the weight of the literature used (50%)]

Presentation – o to 50% [assessment of the merits of the presentation (60%); assessment of student's ability to present and defend their opinion (40%)]

Passing individual parts is possible after obtaining more than half of the possible points for each element of the assessment.

General assessment guidelines:

Sufficient – the student has mastered the content at the textbook level, demonstrated basic skills in presenting and defending his/her opinion, and participated in the class using knowledge gained from reading the basic literature.

Good – the student has mastered the content of the subject, demonstrated ability to present and defend his/her opinion, and participated in the class using knowledge gained from the literature on the subject.

Very good – the student has mastered knowledge of the content of the subject to a full extent, demonstrated above average ability to present and defend his/her opinion, participated in class work, presented knowledge based on a broad literature of the subject.
