ABSTRACT OF THE COURSE

(a synthetic description of the content and objectives of the course; 100-200 words)

The content of the seminar is adapted to the topics of the doctoral dissertations being prepared. Since three dissertations are written, therefore, respectively, the content forms three problem circles: (a) ontology and philosophy of mind in the philosophy of A. Chmielewski; (b) the theory of transcendentals in the light of the ontology of property; (c) justification of duty regarding the theory of the naturalistic error.

The objectives of the course are as follows:

- a) clarification in discussions of the substantive context of the problems raised in the dissertations;
- b) understanding the reconstruction of the theories analyzed in the dissertations;
- c) analysis of written sections of the dissertations in order to optimize them.

The content of the course is adapted to the subject matter of three doctoral dissertations being prepared, which are analyzed and discussed during the seminar, namely:

- 1) the philosophy (and especially ontology) of mind;
- 2) the theory of transcendentals in terms of the ontology of property;
- 3) the problem of justification of practical action.

The topics of the seminary course therefore belong to three philosophical subdisciplines: the philosophy of mind, the metaphysics of transcendental "property", and the theory of practical rationality. All detailed topics have either a strict or indirect (as a substantive background) connection with the research projects of three doctoral students.

Passing the course on the basis of active participation in the seminar plus two written texts (e.g. an article and a section of the doctoral dissertation).
