<b>BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COURSE (100-200 words)</b>				
<p>The primary purpose of the course is to provide knowledge of international legal transactions in civil matters, taking into account international agreements to which the Republic of Poland is a signatory. The course of the lecture will also include the necessary knowledge relating to the provisions of European Union Community law, and covering the specifics of international civil proceedings. The specific goal is for doctoral students to acquire: the ability to practically use systematized knowledge of international civil proceedings and the ability to determine the procedural status of entities of different organizational and legal forms on the territory of the Republic of Poland and the European Union in civil cases with a foreign element.</p>

Specifics of international civil proceedings in Polish law: (a) legal and procedural capacity in international civil proceedings b) costs in international civil proceedings and their security (c) legal aid d) securing of evidence e) foreign public documents (f) actions relating to foreign inheritance and the European certificate of inheritance g) justification of final judgments and issuance of certificates (h) revocation of a judgment rendered in a maintenance case (i) European Account Preservation Order 5. Specificity of international civil proceedings in Community law 6 Recognition and declaration of enforceability (a) recognition of judgments of foreign courts or decisions of other foreign authorities (b) the enforceability of judgments of courts of foreign countries or decisions of other bodies of foreign countries, as well as settlements concluded before or approved by such courts and bodies 7 Recognition and enforcement of certain judgments of courts of the member states of the European Union and authentic instruments and court settlements originating from those states - refusal of recognition or enforcement.
