BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COURSE

(100-200 words)

The primary purpose of the course is to provide knowledge of international legal transactions in civil matters, taking into account international agreements to which the Republic of Poland is a signatory. The course of the lecture will also include the necessary knowledge relating to the provisions of European Union Community law, and covering the specifics of international civil proceedings. The specific goal is for doctoral students to acquire: the ability to practically use systematized knowledge of international civil proceedings and the ability to determine the procedural status of entities of different organizational and legal forms on the territory of the Republic of Poland and the European Union in civil cases with a foreign element.
