SUMMARY OF THE COURSE (synthetic description and aims of the course; 100-200 words)

The aim of the course is to broaden students' knowledge and practise skills related to preparing academic papers for publication, in the field of humanities, social sciences and art. During the classes, the necessary information will be presented regarding the types of academic publications, their content-related and editorial structure, as well as the preparation of academic works for printing and methods of their distribution. Theoretical information will be supplemented with practical exercises in editing individual elements of an academic paper.

COURSE CURRICULUM

- 1. Introductory class: what is an academic publication? Setting the course objectives, preliminary definitions, presentation of the curriculum, presentation of the course credit requirements.
- 2. Types of academic publications, evaluation criteria for academic publications.

Course content:

- types of academic publications: monographs, source editions, chapters in monographs, articles in academic journals, conference papers, posters, other;
- evaluation criteria of academic publications: the scope of the research material, way of approaching the problem (thesis), knowledge of the previous research, presentation of the results, originality.
- 3-4. Content-related and editorial structure of an academic publication: theory and practice.

Course content:

- content-related structure (composition): the IMRAD principle (Introduction, (Materials and) Methods, Results, and Discussion);
- editorial structure: heading, title and subtitle, abstract/summary, key words, main body and side text, citation patterns, other (in accordance with the SEO principles).
- 5. How to submit an article for publication? How to participate in the distribution of one's own academic papers?

Course content:

- criteria of selecting publishers, academic journals or joint academic monographs;
- the individual stages of the publication process;
- lists of publications and journals with points allocated by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education;
- institutions supporting scholarly communication (indexing databases, online academic websites, etc.).
- 6. Psychology of academic writing a short guide. Practical exercises continuation.

Course content:

- schedule for preparing an academic paper;
- anticipating and overcoming difficulties in the writing process.

COURSE CREDIT REQUIREMENTS (ASSESSMENT CRITERIA)

graded credit – decided on the basis of the results of the written assignment and observation during classes

assessment criteria:

- 5,0 (very good) the student has mastered 95-100% of the material included in the course curriculum, he/she demonstrates his/her knowledge in a communicative and linguistically accurate manner, he/she applies it very well in research practice,
- 4,5 (plus good) the student has mastered 90-94% of the material included in the course curriculum, he/she demonstrates his/her knowledge in a communicative and linguistically accurate manner, he/she efficiently applies it in research practice,
- 4,0 (good) the student has mastered 80-89% of the material included in the course curriculum, he/she demonstrates his/her knowledge in a communicative and linguistically accurate manner (minor mistakes are allowed), he/she also applies it in research practice,
- 3,5 (plus satisfactory) the student has mastered 70-79% of the material included in the course curriculum, he/she demonstrates his/her knowledge in a linguistically accurate manner (with minor mistakes), he/she is also able to see its application in research practice,
- 3,0 (satisfactory) the student has mastered 51-69% of the material included in the course curriculum, he/she demonstrates his/her knowledge in a linguistically accurate manner (with some linguistic mistakes), he/she is partially able to notice its application in research practice,
- 2,0 (fail) the student has mastered less than 50% of the material included in the course curriculum, he/she communicates his/her knowledge in a linguistically inaccurate manner (making serious linguistic mistakes), and is unable to see its application in research practice.
