Conference presentations with discussion and evaluation.

COURSE CONTENT

Discussing the principles of preparing a multimedia presentation for a conference paper presented in an oral session.

Discussing the principles for preparing a poster for a conference paper presented in the poster session. Preparation and presentation of a public speech using up-to-date scientific language.

COURSE ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

The student successfully completes the course based on the grade acquired for a conference presentation and a speech intended to assess the learning outcome.

Assessment criteria:

- 5.0 as regards the learning outcomes evaluated, the student has prepared a conference presentation and a speech correctly and with no assistance;
- 4.5 as regards the learning outcomes evaluated, the student has prepared a conference presentation and a speech, with a little help from the instructor;
- 4.0 as regards the learning outcomes evaluated, the student has prepared a conference presentation and a speech, with some help from the instructor and based on mild corrections;
- 3.5 as regards the learning outcomes evaluated, the student has prepared a conference presentation and a speech, with the instructor's assistance;
- 3.0 as regards the learning outcomes evaluated, the student has prepared a conference presentation and a speech, with significant help from the instructor and based on numerous corrections;
- 2.0 as regards the learning outcomes, the student has not prepared a conference presentation or has prepared a conference presentation containing substantial errors, and the speech prepared by him/her requires significant corrections of the instructor.
