BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COURSE (100-200 words)				
<p>The purpose of the course is to prepare doctoral students for public speaking. These competencies include the art of presentations and public speaking at national and international scientific conferences, scientific meetings at the home university, and during the midterm evaluation of a doctoral student, and also include the acquisition of the ability to speak up in a discussion, formulate questions, present arguments, and conclusions. During the classes, the principles of verbal and non-verbal communication and how to use tools helpful during conferences, lectures, and presentations will be presented. The aim is also to develop appropriate posture and gestures, as well as ways to combat stage fright accompanying public speaking.</p>
