BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COURSE (100-200 words)				
<p>The purpose of the course is to prepare the doctoral student to participate in a scientific conference. In carrying out this overarching directive, the cooperation will consist of selecting appropriate, i.e., consistent with the research problem pursued by the doctoral student, conference topics and preparing a public speech in them from this perspective. Attention will be paid to the manner of formulating the topic and the thesis/hypothesis of the speech, the selection of arguments, inference. To this end, the principles of developing a good scientific text will be analyzed.</p>

Semester IV

- 1 Principles of planning and preparation for speaking at a scientific conference. Query of conference proposals, analysis of the subject matter aimed at compatibility with the research problem being pursued (dissertation) selection of appropriate offers.
2. principles of drafting a good scientific text. Analysis of selected examples.
3. preparation of individual parts of the paper . Formulation of the topic, thesis/hypothesis.

Semester VI

- 1 Query of conference proposals, analysis of the subject matter aimed at compatibility with the realized research problem (dissertation) selection of appropriate offers.
2. principles of organization and delivery of the paper at international conferences in English.
3. preparation of individual parts of the paper for an international conference. Formulation of the topic, thesis/hypothesis, argumentation and formulation of conclusions.

Preparation of 2 papers and presentation of them at scientific conferences in each semester (IV and VI). Presentation of written reports with attached abstracts of the papers.
