



Anita Adamczyk, professor at the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism at Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań. In the years 2008-2024 she served as the Dean's Representative for second-cycle studies in political science. She specializes in issues related to: national and ethnic minorities, immigration of foreigners to Poland and Polish and European migration policy. Author of three monographs (*Uwarunkowania pojednania polsko-niemieckiego po 1989 roku*, Poznań 1999, *Spółeczno-polityczne implikacje imigracji do Polski w latach 1989-2007*, Poznań 2012, *(Nie)intencjonalna polityka migracyjna Polski*, Poznań 2021) and many articles.

She has reviewed books and articles in Polish and foreign journals on migration. As part of her scientific activity, she prepared educational materials for employees of public institutions on migration and was the co-author of a report on the economic and social situation of immigrants in the West Pomeranian Voivodeship. Since 2015, she has co-organized the cyclical conference "Multiculturalism-Minorities-Migrations" at the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism in Poznań. She completed scientific internships at the universities in Erbil and Szczecin. She was a participant in the ERASMUS+ program. She received individual scientific awards from the Rector of Adam Mickiewicz University.
