

Ireneusz Pawel Karolewski is professor for political theory and democracy research at the University of Leipzig. In 2009-2019, he was professor of political science at the University of Wroclaw, visiting professor at the Harvard University, guest professor at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and the Université de Montréal. Karolewski obtained his Ph.D. in political science from the University of Potsdam, where he was assistant professor from 1999 to 2009. His main areas of research are democratic backsliding, citizenship, identity politics, and nationalism. In his research, he often focuses on the countries of Central and Eastern Europe. His books include Migration and Border-Making: Reshaping Policies and Identities (Edinburgh University Press, 2020), European Identity Revisited (Routledge, 2016) and The Nation and Nationalism in Europe (Edinburgh University Press, 2011). At Leipzig University, he was the managing director of the Institute of Political Science (2020-2022), coordinator of the M.A. program European Integration in East Central Europe, steering committee speaker of the ECPR Standing Group "Identity", managing Editor "Annual of European and Global Studies"; ordinary member of the Academia Europaea. Karolewski is also recipient of the Research Award of the Kościuszko Foundation (2014) and the Leopoldina Research Award (2012).
