Political scientist and psychologist, specializing in the use of ICT to enhance civic participation and democratic engagement. Has been involved in multiple research projects, including a National Science Centre Poland-funded project examining the implementation of electronic voting systems in Norway, Spain, and the UK, and a study on young adults' political preferences, where she contributed to survey design and analysis. She has also been a co-investigator in the Erasmus+ project dedicated to increasing digital and psychological resilience through peer networking in the online environment in times of crises. Her research explores the intersection of digital tools and political systems, with an emphasis on how ICT can enhance public opinion formation and citizen involvement in decision-making processes, leading to the development of cyberdemocracy. As an active member of international and national political science associations, she engages in global discussions on digital participation. She completed internships and scientific visits in Spain, Norway, Croatia, Serbia,

Italy, Israel, Turkey, etc. She participated in numerous scientific conferences in Poland and abroad. She is experienced in designing and implementing mixed-methods research, in empirical analysis she has skills in survey design, data collection, and statistical analysis, contributing to rigorous data interpretation and outcome evaluation. In addition, she conducts training in communication and e-administration, and has experience in managing and implementing projects financed from public funds.
