

Dr. Juliusz Sikorski is an Assistant Professor in the Faculty of Law and Security at the Jakub of Paradies University in Gorzów Wielkopolski. His research interests include information security, political communication, and information management. His work focuses on the analysis of disinformation, propaganda, and the threats associated with information warfare. Dr. Sikorski's research also extends to data protection, the impact of new technologies on information security, and the activities of Russian disinformation networks and their influence on Poland and the European Union. Dr. Sikorski has an extensive publication record, including monographs, academic articles, and book chapters. He is also the author and co-author of books on the relationship between the state and religious institutions in Poland during the communist era. He has participated in numerous research projects, such as "StopFake PL – an Infodome Against Russian Hybrid Warfare," "Between Hate and Equality: The EU as a Guard of Human Rights and Nondiscrimination" (EUHatEq), "Survey Research on the Perception and Assessment of Security and Informational Influence among Students at Jakub of Paradies University and the University of Opava," and "Verification and Systematization of Terminology in National Security." He is also actively involved in educational projects, including the "Lubuska Summer School" and research workshops for students.
