Level of language proficiency and language structures, few language errors, slight fluctuations in fluidity of speech

- 4.0 shows knowledge of the content of education at the level of 77-84% Level of proficiency of vocabulary and language structures, linguistic errors of communication, slight fluctuations of fluidity of speech
- 3.5 Shows knowledge of the content of education at the level of 69-76% Limited vocabulary and language structures, numerous language errors that interfere with communication and fluency of speech, answers somewhat different from the content of the question asked, incomplete
